**GENERAL ORDER RE: IMPLEMENTATION OF EMERGENCY RELIEF
AUTHORIZED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 68115 BY CHIEF
JUSTICE OF CALIFORNIA/CHAIR OF JUDICIAL COUNCIL
(APRIL 20, 2021 ORDER)**

Exercising the authority granted under Government Code section 68115 and the April 20, 2021 Order of Chief Justice Tani G. Cantil-Sakauye, Chair of the Judicial Council of California, issued in response to the April 13, 2021 request for an emergency order made by the Superior Court of Siskiyou County (“Court”), this Court **HEREBY FINDS AND ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:**

1. In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from April 21, 2021 to May 19, 2021, inclusive, the Court hereby extends the time period provided in section 313 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody pending dependency proceedings must be released from custody to 7 days (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(11));

2. In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from April 21, 2021 to May 19, 2021, inclusive, the Court hereby extends the time period provided in section 315 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody pending dependency proceedings must be given a detention hearing to 7 days (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(11));

3. In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from April 21, 2021 to May 19, 2021, inclusive, the Court hereby extends the time periods provided in sections 632 and 637 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a minor taken into custody pending wardship proceedings and charged with a felony must be given a detention hearing or rehearing to 7 days (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(11));


4. In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from April 21, 2021 to May 19, 2021, inclusive, the Court hereby extends the time period provided in section 334 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a hearing on a juvenile

1 dependency petition must be held to 15 days (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(12));

2 5. In cases in which the statutory deadline otherwise would expire from April 21,
3 2021 to May 19, 2021, inclusive, the Court hereby extends the time period provided in
4 section 657 of the Welfare and Institutions Code within which a hearing on a wardship petition
5 for a minor charged with a felony offense must be held to 15 days (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(12)).

6 6. The time period provided in section 1382 of the Penal Code for the holding of a
7 criminal trial is extended by 30 days, applicable to cases in which the original or previously
8 extended statutory deadline otherwise would expire from April 21, 2021 to May 19, 2021,
9 inclusive. (Gov. Code §68115(a)(10); Executive Order N-38-20 (03-27-20)).
