Re: Defendants w/ Pending Charges of Vehicle Code Section 14601.1(a).

Dear Judge Masunaga:

As you are aware charges of violation of Vehicle Code Section 14601.1(a) may be reduced to infractions pursuant to Penal Code Section 19.8. This is to inform the court of an open offer from our office to all defendants charged with this violation at the misdemeanor level. If they produce proof from DMV that they have cleared their license of all suspensions at arraignment or no later than the first pre-trial conference, then our office will motion to reduce the charge to an infraction. If a representative of our office is not present, then we request that the court reduce the charge under these circumstances.

This open offer does not apply to defendants who are charged with any priors, or violations of VC 14601(a), 14601.2 (a) or (b), and 14601.5(a).

We hope that this will encourage people to pay fines due and otherwise perfect their license status with DMV. Request that the court inform defendants of this opportunity at the arraignments or at other times as appropriate.
